PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Access to Recovery is a program that plays a crucial role in the ongoing struggle against alcohol and drug dependence. It offers support to individuals who have a good chance of recovery.

One of the typical characteristics of alcoholism and drug dependence is denial that there is a problem. Since the people served by Access to Recovery are requesting help, they have broken denial, and have taken the first major step toward recovery.

ACCESS TO RECOVERY

- Callers work one-on-one with the ATR Coordinator, who helps them navigate an often confusing health care system to find appropriate options.
- Every call made to ATR receives a call back for referral within 24 hours.
- ATR staff will contact the providers and make arrangements for an appointment for the caller, and or family members.
- Every referral made is followed up within one day to determine its success
